- _Now it seems to have a technological meaning_
- _We attach different systems and devices to our designs_
- _It's like a modern architectural ornament_
- _However, we are more interested in a type of sustainability that you can't buy, that is intrinsic to the thinking behind the design_
- _A type of sustainability that creates an added value, rather than creating buildings that are ashamed or proud of their carbon footprint_

- _If you can reach two goals with the same resources that you would use only for one, would that be sustainable?_
- _It would at least take us a little bit out of this crazy rush to always consume less and less, while we want more and more_
- _There must be a middle approach_

MIRROR BEACON

- _All the lights present on the site will be replaced during the festival by one beacon_
- _The concentration of light will create a special point where people can meet_
- _The building has a morphed dual character_
- _By day it is a gigantic mirror reflecting the surrounding environment and the people that pass by it, giving a condensed image of the entire festival_
- _By night, it throws a vale of soft light over the entire area and stands as a landmark of orientation for the visitors_
- _Here, light gains the power not only to show but also to guide_
