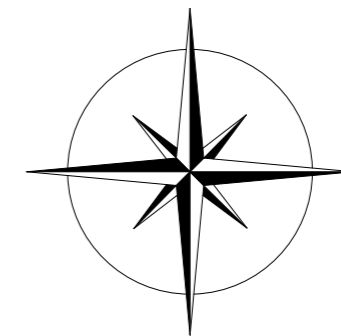
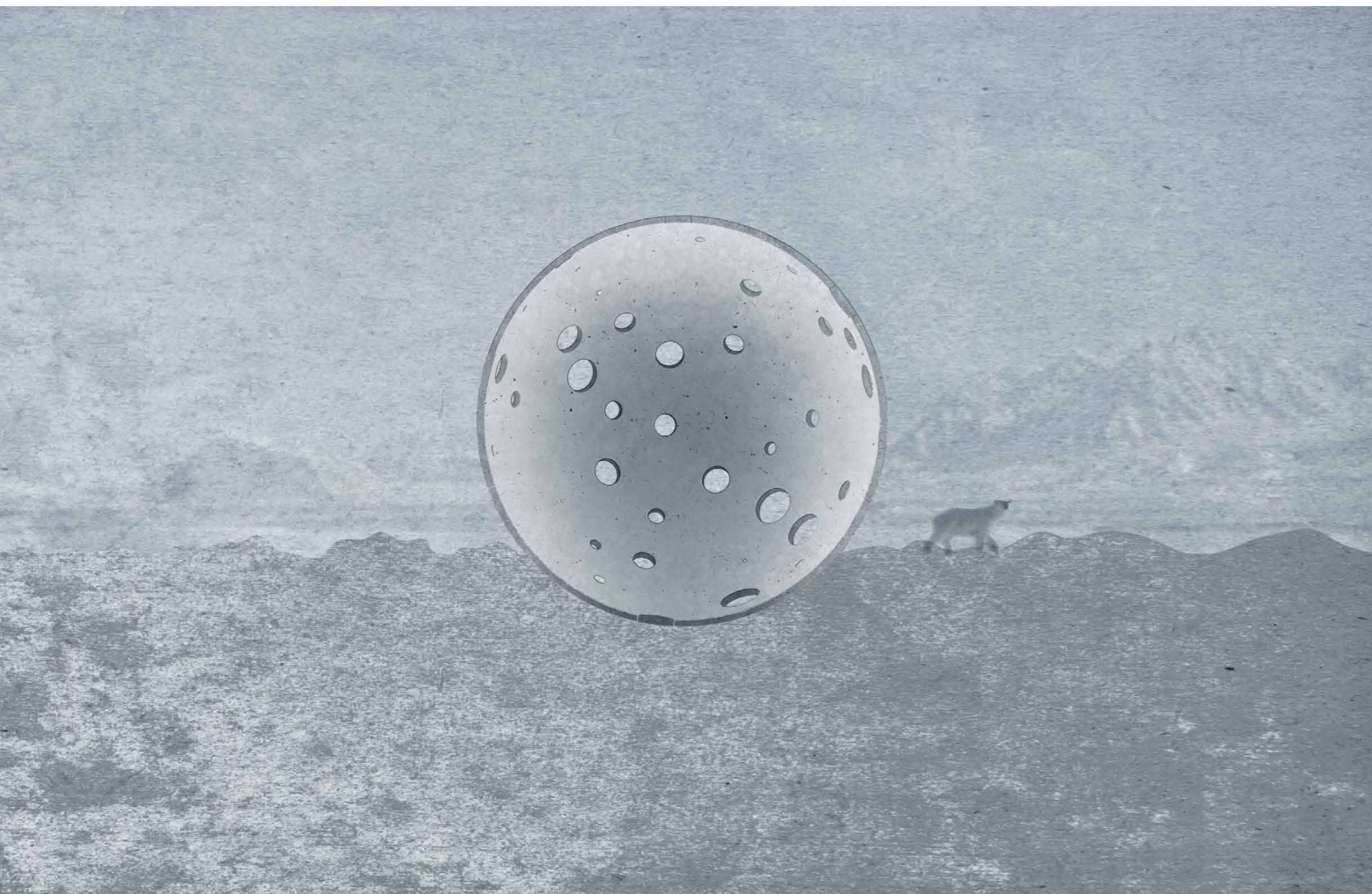




a sphere

A **sphere** (from Greek σφαῖρα — sphaira, “globe, ball”) is a perfectly round geometrical object in three-dimensional space that is the surface of a completely round ball, (viz., analogous to a circular object in two dimensions).



A **sphere** is neutral and non-judgmental. The arrangement of the holes was formed randomly. Thus, no specific direction and orientation is suggested. Furthermore a sphere divides the known from the unknown. The holes break through this line confronting the known and unknown.

A **sphere** demonstrates unity - entirety between culture and people and equality between mankind and nature. It is a solid figure with every point on its surface equidistant from its centre. Since placed naturally into its surrounding the sphere merges and creates a union among architecture and nature.

A **sphere** is a place of reflexion. The North Pole is a result of conjunction and is therefore the logical site for the sphere. The coherence and acceptance between architecture and nature can be demonstrated best here.

A **sphere** is inoperable. The holes allow nature's force to pass through the membrane. The person itself decides how to spend time in or around the house.

A **sphere** is no pilgrimage. It is no building soaked in symbolism. It is the result of non-judgemental, artistic projection of a house without function.
