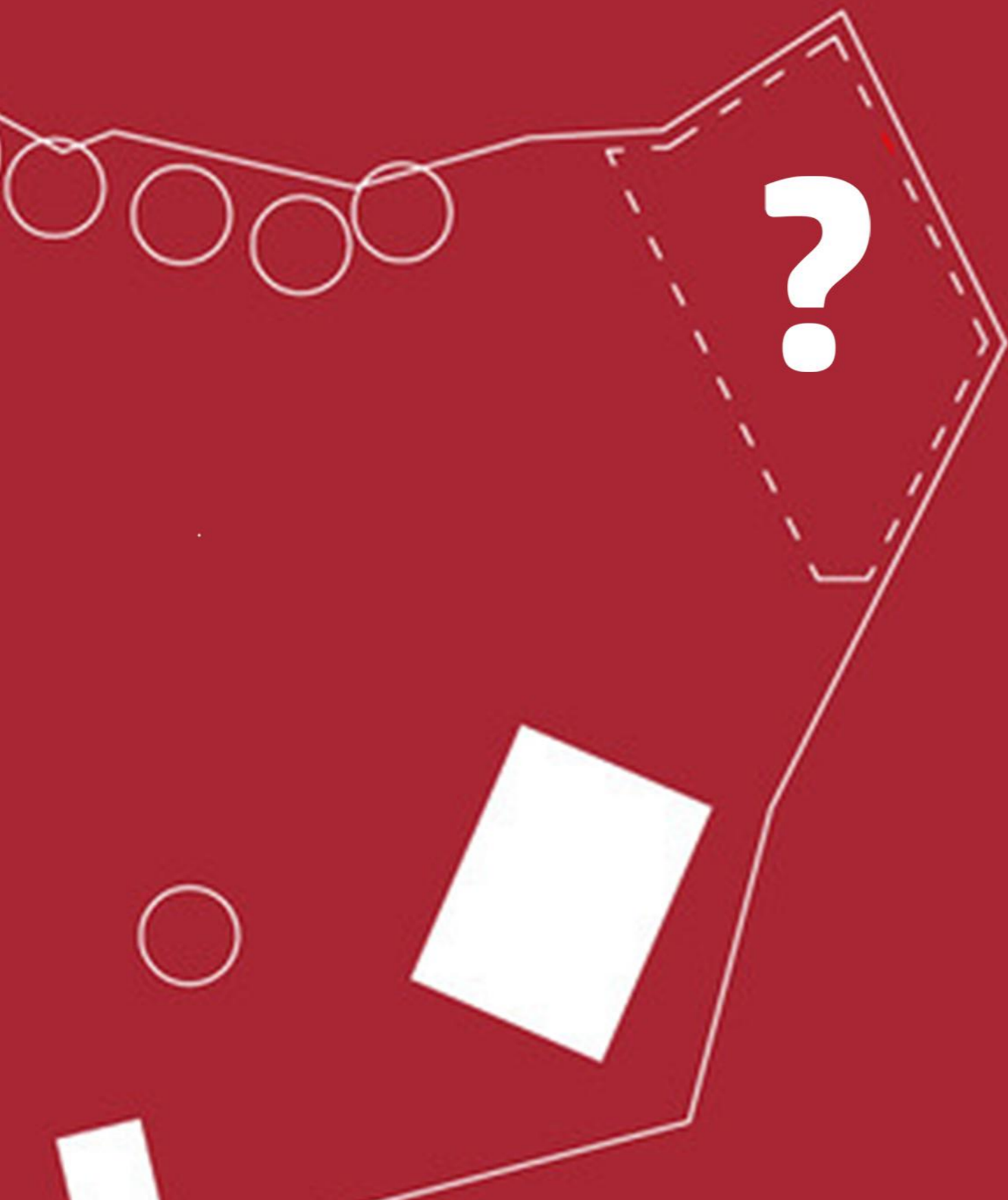


UNBOUND
